**Fire Permits** - reminder - **NO DAYTIME BURNING** – pile sizes are limited to 2m x 2m x 2m - permits are required April 1st - Oct. 31st.

- If there is a fire ban in Bruce Mines, there is a Fire ban in Plummer Township.

**Dog Tags** – due March 31<sup>st</sup> – be kind to your neighbours, dogs are not allowed to run at large, please ensure your dog is kept in your yard at all times and on a leash if out of the yard.

- If you are experiencing an immediate danger from an aggressive dog, contact 911 and report it to the Township office.

**Trailer Permits** – due March 31<sup>st</sup> – please note trailers are not allowed on vacant lots and lots under 1 acre.

**Spring Fling** – May 29<sup>th</sup> – 9 am – 5 pm. Please plan to take advantage of this free debris disposal day to beautify and clear out your yards.

- Contact the office for a Green Waste Site Disposal card if you don't have one well in advance of the date.
