a) EDF Renewables – Solar Powered Generation

- Delegation commenced at 6:05 p.m., W. Colucci discussed EDF Renewables interest in bringing a solar farm to the Township of Plummer Additional
- 300-400 acres of land is required for this farm, which is likely to generate a minimum of 50MW of electricity.
- 200 construction jobs would be brought to the area, with 5 permanent jobs likely to remain once construction is completed.
- Delegate advised Council that if they supported this endeavor, that they would require a letter of support from the Township. EDF Renewables Inc. is aware that planning approvals would likely be required for these projects to move forward.
